3. NEW BUSINESS

3.1 Principal's Information Update

1) Was our school ventilation checked and given the ok? Even the portables?:

The portables each have their own furnace and ventilation system. It has always been that way. There was a new system installed over the summer that is automated and controlled offsite. All buildings are controlled and programmed with this unit. The ventilation system purges air from the rooms prior to school opening and runs all day until staff leave. The unit pulls air in from outside. It is unknown what filters are currently being used; but will be the highest grade that it is meant to have and meet the standard that the schools are expected to have. Iain has asked maintenance for more information regarding the filters.

2) Are all your staff vaccinated? Well I know that we can't actually ask that straight out... How does Cheam staff feel if vaccination becomes mandatory?

Although Iain cannot ask nor answer this question; unofficially from staff volunteering this information Iain suspects there is a high rate of vaccination. BCTF will support vaccinations if the government mandated it.

3) Covid notification - does Cheam staff support how it is being done now?

It would be nice if it was faster but understand there are many variables to collecting information and getting it out to the schools. Iain believes September's reporting was slower. It appears that notifications are coming in faster, a shorter delay between confirmed positive case and school notification.

4) Do you like not having cohorts again?

It is unclear how beneficial cohorts were. Some benefits were having less kids on playground during recess and lunch breaks, however having two separate recess/lunch breaks made scheduling with support staff harder.

5) Are there any staff with masks exemptions?

No staff with mask exceptions

6) Should parent volunteers need vaccination proof while in school? How does staff feel about that?

If staff was mandated to be vaccinated, then parent volunteers would as well.

7) FSA, do all Cheam staff support the teachers federation in NOT wanting them anymore?

The complaints about the FSA comes from what the Fraser Institute does with the results by publishing rankings. In the past there were more complaints but there have been many changes made. FSA is now based on grade 3 curriculum but taken earlier in the year, rather than grade 4 curriculum taken ¾ the way through the year (as a result, students were being tested on information they had not learned yet). There have also been many technological improvements as well. In the end the results do matter as they help to see trends and identify where improvements may be needed.

3.2 Executive Reports

Treasurer

We have had a good month, didn't spend any money this month and made approximately \$3200. After taking out the circle garden fees were at \$19,000 in the bank. Income will be a little less because people have paid for hot lunches that have not come out yet, commitments on account will be adjusted to account for this. The remainder of the 2020-2021 gaming grant (\$3023.23) to be allotted to the circle garden project. We received more funding from gaming grant this time around. We had to reissue a cheque to Guerrilla Q, their payment will be adjusted minus the reissuing fee.

4. OPEN DISCUSSION

A parent of Cheam uses a Hepafilter in their children's bedrooms and is wondering if we should consider getting them for each classroom. These machines help remove extra particles from the air; removes bacteria, pollen, mold, dust mites. The Air doctor pro 3000 (store.airdoctorpro.com) is what this family uses and is putting forward as a

recommendation. These might help add an extra layer of protection year-round in each classroom. It cleans room 3-4 times an hour at most based on each classroom being approximately 600-800 square feet. This family currently has discount code almost makes them ½ price, unsure of when the coupon expires. The units cost \$470/unit in Canadian dollars including shipping and taxes when the discount is applied. Maintenance on these units require the filters to be replaced annually. Filters cost approximately \$160/filter.

Questions raised: Will PAC support with fundraisers or ask for parental help? Will teachers want these units in their classroom? Cannot imagine any teacher opposing these units; Who will be responsible for maintenance? Does our updated HVAC system currently use these higher quality filters and negate the need for these units in the individual classrooms?

Will get more information and more quotes on different units before a decision can be made.
