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Remembrance Day

Remembrance Day marks the official end of hostilities of World War I on November 11th, 1918. World War I was a massive conflict and was played out over the whole globe, but particularly in Europe, where troops from Canada supported the Allied forces. World War I resulted in the loss of huge numbers of lives amongst both civilians and military personnel. The war left great emotional scars in the servicemen who had experienced it, and in the communities who lost so many loved ones. Remembrance Day commemorates those brave men and women who died in armed conflicts, in and since World War I.

Our school will be hosting a ceremony for students to commemorate Remembrance Day on Thursday, November 7th. Parents are welcome to attend. The assembly will begin at 10:30 am. Thursday, November 7th is also National Indigenous Veterans Day, a day of remembrance and commemoration of the contributions of Indigenous veterans.

Please note, Friday, November 8th is a Professional Development Day, so school is not in session for students. Also, schools are closed for Remembrance Day on Monday, November 11th.

Pack It In, Pack It Out

We have been trying to instill a better understanding and appreciation of the need to manage our waste in an environmentally responsible way. At school, we have a system for sorting our waste, including the recycling of a wide range of materials and composting of organic matter. However, with so many individuals on site, it is difficult to ensure all of our waste is being sorted accurately. To help manage this, we are promoting a 'pack it in, pack it out' philosophy. Where this is particularly helpful is with food scraps, which can make a real mess if not handled appropriately. It may also be helpful to you, to see what your kids may not be eating from their lunches. We appreciate your support in this.

Medical Alert Conditions

All students with potentially life-threatening medical conditions and those who require medication and/or special consideration at school should update their documents on file at the school office as soon as possible.



If your child has a medical condition that the school needs to know about, please speak with your child's teacher as soon as possible as well as contact the office so we can be informed.

Peanut Aware

In an attempt to make Cheam a safer place for all of our students, we respectfully ask that you be 'peanut aware'. Please do not send food containing peanuts, or products that 'may contain traces of peanuts'. We fully appreciate how challenging it can be to change habits and find safe and healthy alternatives. Thank you for your support.

Volunteering

If you are hoping to participate in activities in your child's classroom or help with fieldtrips, a Police Information Check (PIC) must be completed. Police Information Checks are mandatory for all volunteers and are valid for four years. We ask that a PIC be completed once while your child is in the Primary grades and again when they are in Intermediate to ensure all PIC's are current. There is no cost for having this done. Forms can be picked up at the school office.

As it can take time for PICs to go through the system, we do encourage you to take care of this step as soon as you're able to. Also, if you'd like to help out with driving, we'll need a driver's abstract on file. Volunteer driver forms need renewed every year.

Labeling Clothing

Our Lost and Found cupboard is often overflowing with jackets, sweaters, and such. To help minimize loss, please put your child's name on the labels of their personal items.

Supervision

A reminder that supervision begins at 8:00 am in the morning. For student safety reasons, please *do not* drop off your children or leave them

unattended before this time. Supervision after school ends at 2:30 pm. Any students that have not been picked up by this time will be asked to wait outside the office.
