Term Two Learning Updates will be issued on Wednesday, March 12th. Please take some time to review it with your child and celebrate the successes they have achieved.

Your teachers will also indicate some areas your child could benefit from focusing on, especially with such a long break ahead of them. The kids have all earned a break from the day to day, but we don't want their progress to be halted. Whereas Term One is like a warm-up for learning, and Term Two sets the pace for learning, Term Three is the long straight away (with some definite uphill sections) to the finish line. This has been an exciting term, and I know there's still so much more adventure in store.

School Goal

To increase our critical thinking in Literacy, Numeracy, and Social Responsibility.

School-Based Team

Many of you will be familiar with the term 'school-based team'. For the benefit of those that don't, an 'SBT' is a group of staff within a school that meets regularly to problem-solve and plan interventions for students who are struggling with any aspect of their education.

The regular members of our SBT include our Principal, our Learning-Assistance teachers, our Resource teacher, our Counsellor and our Child and Youth Care Worker. The SBT will also include the classroom teacher, the parents/guardians of the student in question, and Educational-Assistants that support the student in class. The student may also participate in these meetings (determined

case by case in consultation with parents). At times, other District staff and outside agency representatives may be invited to participate. Additionally, parents can invite a supportive friend or family member to join them.

Typically, it is the classroom teacher that makes the initial referral. However, there are times when it is the parents that request an SBT to discuss concerns they may have. The first step in both cases is for the teacher and parents to talk. If, after discussion, it is felt a larger meeting would be helpful, the teacher will then submit a formal referral to our SBT.

At Cheam, we schedule our SBT meetings on Monday afternoons (between 1:00-2:18 pm). We have some flexibility to meet at other times, however this is the one block of time where we have all staff on site and are able to provide coverage to release the classroom teacher to attend.
