## Planning for September

Staffing is directly related to student enrolment. If you are planning to move, or transfer to another school in Chilliwack, please contact the office as soon as possible.

At this time, it looks like we will continue to have combined grade classes at just about every level. The more accurate a picture we have of our student population, the more proactively we can build our classes for next year. We don't have a lot of flexibility, but where we do, we want to make the wisest decisions.

## Student Placement Information

Staff will be meeting before the end of this school year to discuss the placement of students in classes for next year. To achieve a good balance in each class, we consider many factors:

- Academic achievement and needs
- Class size and composition
- Peer relations
- Previous placement history
- Learning styles

While considering the needs of the school/class as a whole, we take into account the learning and social needs of each child.

Staff members will be working together closely to make thoughtful student placement decisions through a comprehensive process. We do the bulk of this work in June, while we have the students fresh in our minds. We always face a few surprises in the fall, so the stronger our plans are now, the better we can adjust before classes are finalized at the end of the first week of school in September.

## School Goal

*To increase our critical thinking in Literacy, Numeracy, and Social Responsibility.*

With respect to combined classes, please understand that combined classes are a fact of school life and are more the norm than the exception. The thought process we apply in our selection for combined grade classes, in situations where we have options, is as unique as the students we are working with. We are very confident that the students in these classes receive a full and rich academic program at their grade level. And truly, with the way the curriculum has been redesigned in recent years, teachers have the flexibility they require to balance the needs of their students.

We won't hold people to this, and certainly we won't turn anyone away if they haven't signed up. However, if you would prefer to come at a quieter time, or if dealing with parking is a particular frustration for you, you'll be able to get a bit of a sense when the busiest times over the 4-hour period of the event will be. Thanks in advance for your patience and understanding.

In respect to the Talent Show and Choir performances, we will be holding a dress rehearsal at the school on May 9<sup>th</sup>. This performance will be for students only. However, the presentation will be filmed and shared afterwards with our community (via a password protected online platform).

## Parking Lot- General Reminder

The safety of students, staff and community members is our number one concern in and around our parking lot. It is very important we all take time to periodically review the expectations at drop-off and pick-up.

All foot traffic through the lot should be contained to the sidewalks and painted crosswalks. If there is a line-up of cars, please wait until you can pull forward to the crosswalk before letting your child out. If you need to get out of your vehicle to assist your child, please park in a designated stall. It is also essential that drivers not enter the bus lane *unless directed by staff to do so*. The safe walking zone for students along the portables is minimal, so keeping cars out of that area is very important throughout the day.

### **Boundary Review Discussion...To Be Continued**

For the sake of families who may not be fully aware of what this Boundary Review is all about, and what impact it has on our school, here is a basic outline of the proposed plan. The Ministry of Education announced in September 2023 that a new 500-student capacity elementary school would be built on the old Rosedale Elementary site (McGrath Road). The school was initially slated to open in September 2026, but this has recently been adjusted to one year later, September 2027.

The first step outlined in the preliminary boundary review plan is to move all of the K-5 students out of Rosedale Traditional Community School and bring them to the new elementary school. RTCS would then become a Middle School exclusively. This would leave the new elementary school and Rosedale Middle each with about 250 available spaces for students.

The next phase of this preliminary plan looks at moving the Early French Immersion program from Cheam to the new elementary site (and the Early and Late Immersion programs at Chilliwack Middle are also being considered for a move to Rosedale Middle). The District is also considering moving all our English program students to the new elementary site, as well. Cheam would effectively close as an elementary school, and the current catchment area would be redrawn. Most families would fall within the catchment of the new elementary school in Rosedale, but some would become part of either Strathcona Elementary or Little Mountain Elementary catchment areas. Students currently attending Cheam that would then fall within those other catchment areas would still be able to make the move with their classmates to the new school.

In February and March, District staff held preliminary discussions with all school staff and families that would be impacted by these changes.

These talks were just the beginning of a larger process to consult with everyone before a final decision is made. In April, District staff shared their initial planning with our School District Trustees, including all the feedback they received from staff and parents. Now the official process is getting set to begin. The specific details will be communicated soon.
